No I do not live in China but my ancestors came from China. I came into the program in 2002 and have been sober ever since. Last year I had an opportunity to go to China on a business trip and thought I would look up some

of my relatives living to find an AA Sure enough there are too. I got to talking of the meetings and I sponsor use to tell me



in Beijing. I also wanted meeting, if they existed. recovering drunks in China with an old timer after one was relating to him that my that the Chinese symbol for

Crisis and Opportunity were the same symbol. This dual meaning and my Chinese heritage became a major lifeline in my early recovery. The old timer, who by the way was a native of Shanghai, informed me the concept was right in a general way but there was a small distinction I should know about. The symbol for *Crisis* in Chinese is made up of the symbol for *Danger* plus the symbol for *Opportunity*. Learning this small nuance, plus my running across one of "us" in a distance land made my day, to say the least. You know I still cling to the premiss that behind every Crisis there is a golden Opportunity. If I hadn't found my way into AA, had a great sponsor that stressed this lesson, learned how to use the steps in my life I never would have had a chance to go to a meeting in China, meet some fellow AA's and add one more piece to my story of recovery.


Moments in A.A.History

"The Washingtonians"

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On Thursday evening, April 2, 1840, six drinking buddies gathered, as was their daily customs at Chase's Tavern in Baltimore. A well-known temperance speaker was lecturing that night, and four of them thought it would be a good joke to go and hear him. As they discussed the lecture later that evening, one of them proposed (still not quite seriously that they form a total abstinence society, and on Sunday, April 5, while strolling and drinking, the six men did make a decision "to drink no more of the poisonous draft, forever." The name Washington Temperance Society was chosen in honor of George Washington.

What others tell me can be helpful or hurtful guides but if they define my conception of God I am in trouble. As I look over my life I can see God's protection, the words 'my grace is sufficient for you,' have never meant more to me as they do now.
