

I would like to profile a pair of meetings that I have found to be good for the occasional change in perspective.

The first is called Country Roads. It meets out at the Vineland Methodist Church in, wait for it, Vineland. Out on the Mesa. The Church is at 36th Lane and County Farm Road. It is a picturesque little white chapel in the country with a very good sized gymnasium/meeting building at the rear. It meets on Saturday nights at 7:00 PM and is in the schedule. It has been a very large meeting at times in the

past with very good attendance from the city. It has gotten considerably smaller over the last few years and could probably use some support.
