

# How's that work anyway?

This month is the election meeting for the District 8 Committee. All of the positions are open so if your Group would like to stage a coup d'état, this is your chance. In all seriousness, there is no better way to understand the functioning of AA service structure than participation in the District Committee. There are multiple committee chairs open at this time, they are: Bridging The Gap, Public Information, Cooperation with the Professional Community, Corrections, Archives, Grapevine and others. There are also positions that have to do with the function of the District itself. There is almost always a vacancy at Secretary, the Treasurer is a vital

position and then if you really want to make things happen you can be one of the Co DCMs (District Committee Members). All the committee chair positions require a minimum of 2 years of Sobriety. However if you don't have two years and still want to participate, you can serve on a committee and help the chair person perform the duties of that committee. Like attending health fairs with the Public Information Chair and delivering literature to doctors offices for the Cooperation with Professional Community. As a committee member it will give you a reason to attend the quarterly Area Assembly meetings and learn really: How's that work anyway?

There is a meeting every Monday at the Pueblo county jail for male inmates, you must be cleared by the sheriffs office to attend.
