Please continue to purchase your AA conference approved and grapevine literature from the CSO. We also have a great selection of pamphlets available and they do make a little more money than the books.


#### Halloween!

# IN THE SPOT LIGHT

Why do we need a CSO? What does the CSO do?

For those of us who are new or have isolated themselves to a single meeting, The Central Service Office is located on Club Manor Drive on the north side of Pueblo north of Hwy 50West in a strip mall that is anchored by Parker Pools and Spas. The address is 4035-A Club Manor Drive.

The office provides services for Districts 8, 6 and 3, in Area 10. This means we list meetings for **District 8** which includes Pueblo, Canon City, Colorado City, Florence, Gardner, Laveta, Rye, Trinidad, Walsenburg and Westcliffe. **District 6** is

the Arkansas valley and highway 50 corridor from Rocky Ford to Springfield including laJunta, las Animas, Fort Lyon, Lamar, Ordway and Walsh. **District 3** is the entire San Luis valley from the town of San Luis to Creede in the northwest corner of the valley. From Antonito to La Jara, Monte Vista, Del Norte, and Alamosa.

Basically we serve the entire south eastern quarter of the state from our little office in Pueblo. What do you mean by "serve"?

First we maintain a 24 hour answering service for the public to contact AA by phone. The office hours are 10 AM to 4 PM weekdays. When the office is open a caller will speak to a volunteer, AA member. After hours we have an answering service that contacts volunteers that have provided their phone number. The answering service then gives the phone number of the caller to the volunteer to call back and answer questions and help. Second, we maintain a website that includes a meeting schedule and general information about AA in Southern Colorado. Third, we keep an inventory of conference approved literature and Grapevine publications, sobriety milestone coins and a library of old grapevine magazines that can be checked out and read. Fourth, the CSO puts on events. We put on the Annual Fourth of July picnic, when we get enough interest and funds we put on a Long Timers event to celebrate and hear from our members with 20 yrs or more of sobriety. The CSO works in conjunction with the District, to put on the OcSoberfest when we get to do that again.
